Procurement Event under the Zero Emissions Credits RFP

Invitation to Comment on the Contract Form

Public Act 99-0906 (the “Future Energy Jobs Bill”) was signed into law on December 7, 2016 and became effective June 1, 2017. This legislation calls for the procurement of Zero Emission Credits (“ZECs”) from Zero Emission Facilities to be delivered under a long-term contract for a delivery term of 10 years. A “Zero Emission Facility” means a generating unit that is fueled by nuclear power and is interconnected with PJM or MISO. NERA Economic Consulting has been retained by the Illinois Power Agency (“IPA”) as the Procurement Administrator for this procurement event.

On October 27, 2017, the Procurement Administrator posted to the [procurement website](#) a draft Zero Emission Credit Agreement (the “ZEC Contract”) proposed to be the standard contract form between each winning supplier and each of Ameren Illinois Company (“AIC”), Commonwealth Edison Company (“ComEd”), and MidAmerican Energy Company (“MEC”). The Procurement Administrator invites interested parties to submit their comments on the draft ZEC Contract.

All comments received in accordance with the process outlined below will be reviewed by representatives from the IPA, AIC, ComEd, MEC, the Procurement Administrator, the Procurement Monitor, and Staff of the Illinois Commerce Commission. The timeline and process for interested parties to provide comments is as follows:

- Each of your comments must be clearly indicated with tracked changes in Microsoft Word. We strongly encourage you to provide explanatory notes either in a separate document or highlighted in tracked changes.
- **The deadline to provide comments is 6 PM Central Prevailing Time (“CPT”) on November 10, 2017.**
